Calling All Pastors

The Presbytery of Yukon will be joining with the ELCA (Lutheran) Alaska Synod's to sponsor an **Intergenerational Trauma and Resilience Workshop** next month. The event begins at 4 p.m. on Tuesday, April 24 at the Gorsuch Commons on the UAA campus in Anchorage. It is scheduled to end by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, April 25. This event will be part of the annual Collegium event held by the ELCA Alaska Synod for their clergy but, this time, is co-sponsored by the Presbytery of Yukon. All pastors in the presbytery are encouraged to participate.

For presbytery members, this follows up on the pledge we made in Utqiaġvik last February. At that time, the presbytery joined with the national PC(USA) in pledging to walk in new ways with the village communities in which we operate. Part of that walking in a new way calls on us to recognize the spiritual ills brought about when the western, European-based culture collided with the indigenous people already living on the land. This workshop provides an opportunity for the pastors of the presbytery to come together to become more informed as a part of following up on that pledge.

The Intergenerational Trauma and Resilience workshop is informed by the ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences) studies that help us understand what historical trauma is and how it has affected children across rural Alaska. This workshop is also informed by Christian teaching on repentance and healing through the grace of God and the power of the Holy Spirit. Presenters at this event include MSW and Presbyterian Ruling Elder, Lucy Apatiki of Gambell, and addiction counselor and Christian teacher, Dorothy Bekoalok, originally from Shaktoolik.

You will be staying in our Outback in our A-frame tents all week while cooking your own food over the campfire and learning how to do everything in the outdoors. We will also be doing some offsite hiking, climbing, and probably a canoe daytrip on a local river. This camp will require hiking and backpacking. It's a 1/4 mile uphill hike to our Outback camp.

July 15-20 **H2O Adventure Camp** **Grades 6-8**
Cost: \$325... Early Bird Price before April 15 is \$275

This is a camp where you will spend a great deal of your time at camp in water based activities. In Harding Lake and on the shore you will get soaked regularly. So be prepared to enjoy the water through tubing, amazing water games, and in ways you never thought you would use water. Come prepared to learn a lot about the outdoors in this camp. You may be staying a night or two in the Outback in our A-frame tents and the rest of the week in one of our cozy cabins. You will learn to cook your own food over the campfire and learn how to do many other things in the outdoors. This is a mixed cabin and outback tent camp.
