Presbytery of Yukon at GA

The 221st General Assembly of the PC(USA) was held in Detroit last month. The Presbytery of Yukon had its own booth at GA and was therefore much more "front and center" than usual. The booth focused on two particular ministries: the Gambell Presbyterian new church building, and the presbytery sponsored Climate Change Conference scheduled for this September. Both ministries invite Presbyterians from across the country to participate.

Danna Larson from the First Presbyterian Church of Anchorage, and Mike Apatiki from the Gambell Presbyterians Church traveled to Detroit to staff the booth. Both are members of the presbytery's Gambell Church Building Committee. Other members of the presbytery were present and also helped staff the booth from time to time:

- Tiffany Immingan was present as the presbytery's advocate for the overture promoting Sustainable Living through Guiding Development through the Precautionary Principle, which passed unanimously. Tiffany was also a great help at the booth.
- Ruling Elder Jan Burger (Palmer United Protestant Church), Teaching Elder Ian MacInnes-Green (at large member of the Presbytery), and Youth Advisory Delegate Samuel Ahsuak (Utqiagvik Presbyterian Church) were present as voting commissioners to General Assembly. Despite their busy schedules, each spent at least a small part of their time staffing the booth.
- Stated Clerk Sharon Rayt and Presbytery Executive Curt Karns were present as presbytery staff, and also helped with the booth.



The memorial service for Louise Weeks will be held on July 27th at 3pm at Trinity Presbyterian Church. Louise, the wife of the late Rev. Ralph Weeks, passed away in March.

Hallelujah! The building materials for the new church building in Gambell will be on the next barge! Here they are packaged for shipping.



The Reynolds Brothers pre-fabbed the building and packaged them for shipping, and will assure that they are properly assembled. The Reynolds are also members at Jewel Lake Parish, one of Gambell's partner churches in the presbytery. The projects featured at the booth garnered a great deal of attention from the Exhibit Hall visitors. The Gambell New Church project will need volunteers from across the country next summer. Although a construction company based in Nome will put up the outer shell this summer, volunteer work teams will construct the interior and prepare the building for use in the summer of 2015. A number of people signed up at General Assembly to receive more information about how their churches could send a work team next summer. More information about the project, and about registering a work team next summer, is available at the presbytery's web site for the <u>Gambell New Church Building</u> Project.

The presbytery is also hosting the Presbyterians for Earth Care's Regional Conference in Alaska Sept. 2-7 of this year. Presbyterians from across the country will be coming to hear from some of the University of Alaska's scientists about the urgency of the climate change crisis. Scientists, Christian faith leaders and leaders from Alaska's villages will be present to give guidance on how climate change is affecting Alaska and to ask how we can effectively respond as disciples of Jesus Christ. There is still room new registrants. Interested people were directed to the presbytery's web site on the Regional Conference to register.

Several visitors to the booth expressed gratitude for booths like ours that focus on specific ministries happening in various regions of the country. The Exhibit Hall provided a wonderful opportunity to taste a bit of the variety of the ministry that is happening in so many different contextual settings through the PC(USA).


to all rural and urban teens in grades 8-12 who are ready to be Youth Organizers and lead AYEA's 2013-2014 statewide campaign.
