



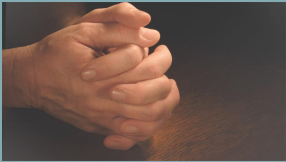

Alaska Airlines Policy Changes

As of October 2nd, Alaska Airlines has changed their policy on missed flights. Their updated No-Show Policy now states that if you are not going to fly on a scheduled itinerary **you must let them know before your flight departs** in order to receive the value of your ticket as credit to use on a future flight. If you don't cancel your ticket before your flight departs, your flight will be cancelled and (unless you purchased a refundable fare) you will **forfeit the cost of the ticket and will NOT be able to use it for future flights.**

They do say that they will offer a grace period and will allow an exception through the end of 2017 in case you forget to tell them in advance.

Change and cancellation fees will continue to be waived for MVP Gold and MVP Gold 75K members. However, changes and cancellations must be made before your flight's departure time to be eligible for credit toward a future flight (unless you purchased a refundable fare).
