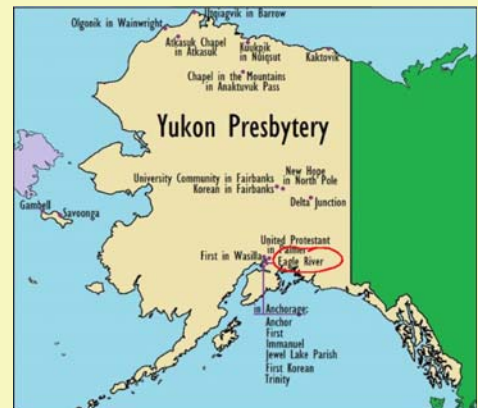

Eagle River Presbyterian Church, Eagle River

Eagle River Presbyterian Church is blessed to be "the church in the center of the community with the community at heart," and this year our heart for the community looks green. We removed some old wood chips and landscaping and were able to plant grass in front of our building, to sow wildflowers along the highway, and rework our interior lighting systems to be more energy-efficient.



Over the last several years we have worked to increase our outreach to our community through expanding our ministry with the Chugiak/Eagle River Food Pantry. The Food Pantry is an ecumenical effort supported by many churches and community organizations and housed in dedicated rooms in our building, feeding around 120 families each month. Several years ago we adopted a 'client-choice' model of Food Pantry management, meaning that the clients are able to 'shop' for the meat, produce, bread and canned goods that most suit their family's needs, leading to less waste and more dignity for the Food Pantry clients. We are in partnership with the Food Bank of Alaska, purchasing food in bulk to keep our food costs down and maximize the amount of food we are able to share with the community. This summer we continued our

'greening of the church' emphasis by constructing and planting garden beds in the lot north of our building, growing broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, peas and potatoes. Church members shared the duties of watering and weeding, and every Tuesday evening the harvest was donated to the Food Pantry, often being claimed before the fresh produce even made it to the shelves.

We also share our building with Alcoholics Anonymous, Al-Anon, a mom's play group, the Alaska Celtic Pipes and Drums, and many other community groups. This summer we helped another church building by sending Dale and Emily Berry to work on the new church building in Gambell, understanding that our heart for the community doesn't end at the borders of our town, but extends throughout Alaska and the world, wherever God sends us to be his hands and feet and voice and heart to his world!
