

The Residents of St. Lawrence Island Need Our Immediate Assistance

This spring the St. Lawrence Island communities of Gambell and Savoonga were declared an economic disaster area due to the extremely low walrus harvest. The unusually wet and cold weather, coupled with ice pack around the island, lead to only 36% of the average yearly harvest. These communities rely on the walrus for food and the ivory from the walrus tusks is vital to the local economy. This year's low harvest has placed an extremely heavy economic burden on the people of these communities, as they lack both the food and cash needed to support themselves and their families.

The Presbytery of Yukon is in the process of applying for an Immediate Needs Grant through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). Other courses of assistance are being pursued as well, as the PDA grant is only a drop in the bucket compared to the assistance that is required.

With that concern in mind, the Presbytery of Yukon, together with local ecumenical partner denominations, is asking for cash donations to help support the people of St. Lawrence Island in this time of need. The Presbytery of Yukon will be coordinating this endeavor and asks that donations be sent to their office at 616 W. 10th Avenue, Anchorage, AK 99501. Please make the checks payable to the Presbytery of Yukon and be sure they are designated "St. Lawrence Assistance Fund". Individual churches may also set up special offerings designated to help the residents of the island.

Thank you so much for your assistance and please keep the communities in your prayers. Together we can make a huge impact on the lives of those in need.

Addressing hunger together in a world of abundance

Greetings to members of the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board, mid council executives, and friends,



Reformation Day is a day on which we Presbyterians are called with our brothers and sisters in the Lutheran and Reformed traditions not only to look back in gratitude to God toward the unique heritage we share but also to consider the present and contemplate the future.

Because alleviating hunger and eliminating its causes stands at the very heart of the church's life, I invite you to take action with us—Stated Clerk Gradye Parsons, General Assembly Moderator Neal Presa, and other Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) leaders and members—by joining in an important new denomination-wide initiative, the <u>SNAP/Food Stamp Challenge</u>.

For one week, November 17–23, we have committed to live on the average daily food stamp benefit of \$4.25* per person per day (*in Kentucky). We will experience firsthand how to make careful food shopping choices, learning in the process how challenging it is to avoid hunger, afford nutritious foods, and stay healthy. Up to 49 million Americans have depended upon the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which is undergoing deep cuts.

We acknowledge that many people — whether or not they are dependent on SNAP benefits — live within these allowances every day. Financial pressures on so-called middle-class individuals and families are also of great concern: our economy must be just and fair for all.

By joining in the <u>SNAP/Food Stamp Challenge</u>—and intentionally living within these allowances together—we pray that awareness will be raised, consciences stirred, and actions taken so that all people have access to life's basic necessities. If you are unable to take part in the SNAP/Food Stamp Challenge, our <u>website</u> contains information on other ways—prayer, action—in which you will be able to participate in the initiative.

Andrew Kang Bartlett, associate for national hunger concerns with the <u>Presbyterian Hunger</u> <u>Program</u>, recently said: "Here's a great time to help other people become aware of hunger in the US and overseas. We've got to look deeper at the underlying causes of hunger and at solving the real tragedy of hunger in a world where there's so much abundance."

May we all continue to work to make our relationships right with God's creation, making good choices that improve the world around us and contribute to the well-being of all of God's children.


