wonder and joy at a Savior-child born in such a humble estate. But such is our real life-so full of potential for terror, and for peace; for trauma and joy.

One of the dangers of Christmas is to water down the gospel, so that we proclaim only the warm and fuzzy moment of holding a baby, without pointing to the transforming power this fledgling life brings to the world. In a world of people needing salvation - salvation from the social ills of intergenerational trauma; salvation from the suffering of creation due to advancing climate change; salvation from the injustices of wealth, power and privilege; salvation from all forms of sin; and salvation from the death that encroaches upon all of our lives-in a world needing salvation, the birth of a savior is more than just the warm feelings of holding a baby in one's arms.

Yet, what is more reality-grounding than a moment of such intimacy? One of the amazing things about Jesus' birth is that God brings the transformation the world truly needs through real people, and through relationships that matter. A moment witnessing the intimacy of a parent and a child can ground us in our hopes and dreams for all people-that none will be unloved and uncared for; that none will be isolated and alone; that none will suffer injustice without a way to respond with resilience and hope.

This Christmas, I plan to renew my ties with family and with friends as we gather at Christmas. I hope you get to do that, too. In that renewal, I hope we will also renew our commitment to serve God however God calls. Indeed, Christmas is about light entering darkness-that's why our forebears chose to put it so near the solstice and the new year. It is about hope in a world that is starving from hopelessness. It is about God, seeing our need, and joining with us in the flesh-the flesh of a baby named Jesus. In the new beginning marked by that birth, truly amazing things continue to become possible-for that is the way of the world.

This Christmas, I hope you see the baby in the manger. I also hope the awareness of that birth stirs a burning fire in your soul-a fire for the power and lightnings of God moving throughout the world.

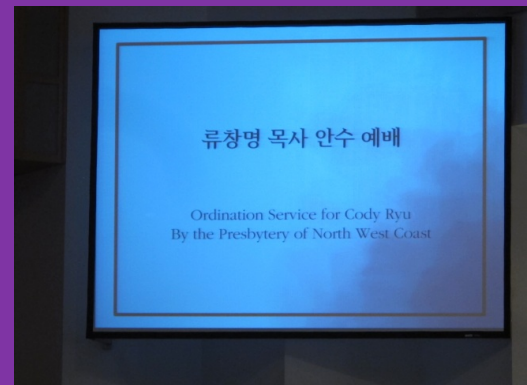

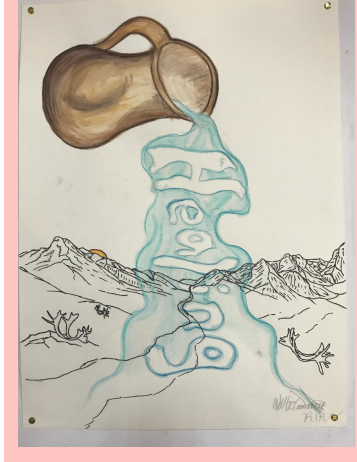
